NL FEDERAL HIGHLIGHTS



Introduction

MQO Research spoke with 600 residents of Newfoundland and Labrador to gauge the political temperature in the province for the October edition of our quarterly political poll: Atlantic Matters.

Federal Politics

According to the latest polling numbers, the Liberals have a 35-point lead over the second place Conservative Party. Among decided and leaning voters:

- Support for the Liberal Party trended up 3 percentage points to 60%.
- Conservative support edged down 4 percentage points to 25%.
- $\circ~$ NDP support trended up 3 percentage points to 14%.
- Support for the Green Party exhibited little change at 1%.
- The undecided / no vote group was relatively unchanged at 34%.

Government Performance

Rating for the leadership of Prime Minster Justin Trudeau held relatively steady with a mean score of 5.3 (on a 10-point scale).

The Atlantic Matters poll was conducted by telephone from October 12^{th} to October 26^{th} , 2018 and included 600 randomly selected eligible voters from across the province. The margin of error for the total sample is ± 4.0 percentage points 19 times out of 20.






FEDERAL POLITICS – NL TREND
