NB FEDERAL HIGHLIGHTS



Introduction

MQO Research spoke with 400 residents of New Brunswick to gauge the political temperature in the province for the Winter edition of our quarterly political poll: Atlantic Matters.

Federal Politics

According to the latest polling numbers, the federal Liberals maintain lead in New Brunswick, though numbers have remained largely unchanged since February. Among decided and leaning voters:

- o Support for the Liberals remained at 42%.
- Conservative support fell very slightly by 2 percentage points, resting at 31%.
- Support for the Green Party held at 14%., falling 1 percentage point.
- NDP support remained relatively steady, raising by 1 percentage point to 9%.
- Support for the People's Party remained at 1%.

The Atlantic Matters poll was conducted by telephone from August 12^{th} to September 2^{nd} , 2020 and included 400 randomly selected eligible voters from across the province. The margin of error for the total sample is \pm 4.9 percentage points 19 times out of 20.




